**There is but one remaining Deluxe Edition**, with a slipcover case, available only from the Copper Corner, as above. The cost is \$250 postpaid in the USA. Very expensive to the UK, fair warning.

**The May list seems to be the one where** I talk a bit about the plans for the fall. Thus, will tell you what I know at the moment. First, Coin Ex, the major show of the season, will be held a week earlier than usual, September 22 and 23. As you might know, Baldwin’s has been split up---they are still there for coin sales and purchases, but with a new staff. The main portion of their staff moved as a group to Sovereign Rarities, and if you have coin wants they are there to serve. The tokens, what we are interested in, have been sold to Steven Fenton, of Knightsbridge Coins, and the auction arm of Baldwins is combined with St James auctions, and is now Baldwin’s of St. James.

There are two auctions scheduled for June 2017. **DNW** has a sale slated for 14-16 June, it has a few tokens in it, and quite a few mixed large groups of tokens in various grades. Sale is up on line—**www.DNW.co.uk**.

Baldwin’s at St. James have two auctions, the first June 21, which will have 192 token lots, a fair number of those are single tokens, the rest small group lots of around five pieces each. The average grade of these seems to be EF. The latter firm has another one slated for 4 October, with content unknown, but it will probably be a lot like the June sale for style.

The June sale at Baldwin’s at St. James will be all English, no tokens from Wales, Scotland, or Ireland. Once again, it is June 21st, if you wish to bid. If you wish to gain access to the sales they will have, (and have been assured that many tokens out of the basement will be in them ) please contact Lisa Norfolk, numismatist, at Baldwin’s of St. James, for ordering catalogues. . **LANCASTER 57bis** 1794 Bust Eccleston//Ship. The original piece, the 57, had the maker's name, PONTNOR, etched at the bottom of the coat. The 58 had this covered over. This one is then a 58 obverse. The reverse is from the unpolished die with a period after commerce. Thus it is a re-worked 58 obv. die, and an original 57 rev. die. I have no idea how many are out there like this, but I have seen a LOT of 58's, and it is the only one I have ever seen. No one else has reported it, either. Obviously **extremely RARE (RRRR?)**, basically all brown, UNC, and yours for \$395.

LANCASTER 58 1794 Bust Eccleston//Ship. Nice, some red, luster. UNC \$135.

LANCASTER 59c ND Hand holding scroll//15 stars, radiated. Considered an American colonial coin, the "Kentucky" cent, for the 15<sup>th</sup> star, when Kentucky joined the Union. Two here, one has "is just" readable, but worn to a good Fine, \$250. The other is EF+, with "our cause is just" readable, and easily so. Undated, but 1795. Good solid collectable at \$465.

**George III---40mm Bz Death medal. Bust of George III//Britannia weeps at funeral. 1820. EF, nice \$125.**

**Gifford’s Balloon over Paris---1878, View of Paris, and balloon above, //Souvenir of ascencion---50mm---these seen by me, but usually toned or damaged-- but this one is with hanger, fully gilt, and as new, \$145.**

**BOX COIN---made from a 1797 Twopence, Coin GF, workmanship EF, opens from the side, and you can put something in it, all operational and nice \$265.**

**The Wright Brothers--- 80 X 58mm bz plaque, US Mint---Bust of Orville and Wilber, “in recognition of their success in navigating the air”---Rev, Angel flying, “man shall mount up with wings, as eagles!! Issued by the US mint on March 4, 1909 by resolution of Congress, this plaque is like new. Hard to locate. \$265.**

**Military occupation of Cuba---1898-1902. A bronze medal, 35mm with ribbon and hanger, “Army of Occupation, Military government of Cuba”, as made \$120.**

**A Printing Plate---copper, 68X99mm, Man’s Bust ¾ left, serpent and staff. Below J. Jenkins, Chemist and druggist’ Ashby De La Zouch//Genuine Horse and Patent Medicines---1850’s, unique, I assume \$260.**

**England---Art Union medal, 55mm bronze. Bust of Frances Chantry (a sculptor), the reverse is Chantry’s monument to James Watt, and has Watt seated on a plinth. Marvelous condition, about new \$125.**

**France, WWI---Bz medal, 63mm, 1919 Versailles/Saint Germain, France weeps//Eagle in tree. VF \$65.**

**France, WWI---Bz medal, 67mm, heavy, France standing, flag//WWI Soldier standing, horn. Made for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WWI, 1968. Nice medal \$45.**

**USA---WW I-----BZ, 63mm heavy medal, Man with hammer about to hit snake on an anvil, a cannon and ship in the background, “Presented by the American Car and Foundry Co//the reverse, with a female, and the statue of Liberty//for service faithfully rendered”---made by the Gorham company. There is no place for a name, but these were apparently presented to those who worked at the plant during WWI. First I have seen, they seem to be rare, and a wonderful piece of history. Only GVF, for dark flecks in places, just \$65.**

**USA---Philippines, WWII---BZ, 64mm. Bust MacArthur imposed over an Eagle//Figure of MacArthur striding, with men, into the waves “I shall return”---Commemorative, 1972, high relief. Neat \$95.**

**Shipwreck Treasure Coin---in 1809 a storm sank the Admiral Gardener, as it was leaving for India with a shipment of coin to be used to pay workers in Bengal and Madras by the East India Company. This coin, a 20 cash, was brought up from the deep 176 years later. With certification sheet, have six, \$35 each.**

**AND FINALLY---something special---a copper medal by T. Pingo, Bust George II//Female figure seated mournfully under a pine tree. “CANADA SUBDUED”, 1760. Bronze, 41mm, GVF to EF, very nice condition, Lists in Colonial Lore as Betts 430. A very rare item---\$850.**

**SIEGE OF PARIS--by the Prussian Army, -1870-71.** This is an amazing medal, **silver**, 65mm, in a framed and glazed turned brass holder (over 100mm) allowing viewing of both sides of the medal. It was presented to the Society of English Friends, with the engraved legend, in French, thanking the society for going to the aid with goods to the Commune of Villemomble during the Franco-Prussian war-- with their "profound esteem". Villemomble is about 9 miles to the **east** of Paris, and it is not known how the English managed to send supplies to the Commune during the Prussian siege!! **As to the medal, some inquiry leaves it as expected, most likely UNIQUE--**it is unknown by any in the trade in the UK or France, save this one. This EF, in the original box. Medal, all hand engraved on a shaved agricultural piece-- the brass holder about new-- all contained in the box (114mm) is VF+. Rarity, condition, history, it has it all. -- \$1125.  
A second note on this-- The only one known belonged to the society in England, they disbanded some years ago. The medal made its way to the sale floor----I could not resist it. This is, of course, a piece with no value at all, except what the owner puts on it. Many thought it worth twice my asking price.

**ANTI- SLAVERY** Bust, William Wilberforce/Alligorical scene, "I have heard their cry" &c---Wilberforce pushed through Parliament a bill outlawing slavery in all its forms in the British Empire. This medal was made to celebrate that, in 1807. Very minor rim tics, otherwise EF and beautiful, AE, 53mm, this piece is a very important one, with super surfaces and nice luster, bronzed, great eye appeal. \$950.

**Bust George III//Preserved from Assassination.** Bust R//Eye of Providence over a burning alter. This a 48mm AE medal by Kuchler, Soho mint, 1800. The King was shot by a madman at Drury Lane Theater, but was basically not in mortal danger. Eimer lists this at 260 pounds, in EF. This a nice EF, but \$295 US.

### **The Colorado Silver Dollars of 1933.**

**In 1933, the depression** was in full swing, and mining states were suffering. No silver dollars were being made, and there was little demand for silver. Colorado put out four medals extolling the value of silver, and sold them at \$1 each. Silver at the time was around \$16 an ounce!! Each is silver, 38mm, 1 ounce.

Type one, two and three are all engraved. Made for the 1933 fair in Chicago, the makers decided that #1 was self serving, saying it would bring prosperity to Colorado. Changed that to # 2, simply deleting Colorado, then decided that was not enough and for # 3 added "trade mark Colorado" All were deemed not what they wanted, and type 4, a really nice struck piece with a mining scene, was made. **All four here. Group, \$950**

**Type one**----300 Issued, H&K 867, and quite rare today. PL UNC, MS 63, \$350.

**Type two** --2000 struck, most melted, so number is unknown. H&K 868 AU, very light toning, nice \$125.

**Type three**—Struck from the 2000 above, later melted down to make type four. H&K 869 Ch. AU, \$150.

**Type four** --mintage unknown, struck. Mining scene//Sheld of the state of Colorado. UNC, nice \$465.
