February, 2014. It is time again for a quarterly list, my 75th!! Cannot believe how time flies. Last year was quite eventful for me, especially all the trips to the doctor, just part of getting older, I guess. I waited patiently for someone to do another issue of D&H, but no one stepped forth, so I decided to do it. My initial thought was to do a complete revamp of the book---include all the new pieces, photos, and so on, but there were two problems with that idea. First, it would probably take me 5 years to do, and the book is needed now. Second, it could not be done without re-numbering----and with all collectors using the old numbers, it would be confusing to say the least. Dalton and Hamer ran across the problem when they did the original book, as they failed to leave space in the numbering system to accommodate anything new. Thus, the "bis" designation, which really is not correct in many places, as the piece inserted had nothing to do with the token to which it was connected. So, all considered, the new book will be as the old, with updates.

The new book is in the works, it shall have an updated addenda, quite a few explanation sections, for rarity, grading, and more, and the addenda shall be in the back of the book. I am looking for a LOT of input from all who read this list as to what you would like to see, and I do need all new finds, --tokens, metals, edges, etc, for the new addenda---which will be covered all in one list. Anything you have must be to me by the first of June, as it is planned to go to the printer the first of July for fall release.

The CTCC elections are this year, and if you would consider running for office, you would be welcome to do so. The offices of President, Vice President USA, Vice President UK, and Treasurer are open, as well as new members for the board of directors. There is one vacancy on the board as we speak, due to the death of Dr. Doty. If you would like to serve, please let us know, you will happily be put on the ballot.

Last year's auction season in the UK was a bit different. Not many 18th C tokens available from England, Scotland, or Wales, but a fair number auctioned from Ireland. It is to be noted that condition was the key to the bidding. Rarity counted, but nearly any common token with wonderful color, nice surfaces, luster, and just a super look sold for, in some cases, as much as it might have had it been rare. It was not just one happening, it happened over and over, so it seems that the collectors are more condition aware than they ever were. I came home with a fair number of very nice pieces, and they will be sold as we go through the year. If you are looking for any particular token, ask, I might have it.

This list contains many new purchases, and some items not seen on my list in some time. Enjoy--Bill
