A Big Hello to all-----

Winter is in full force, and for those buried under snow and ice, you have my sympathy---the rest of us might be a bit cold but muddling though. I mentioned the London BBIII sale in the opening salvo of the last list, and by now have received all I purchased and have had a chance to look through the lots. Many of the single tokens purchased are really nice. The group lots were as special as I thought they might be.

There were a huge number of Anglesey tokens, some very rare, and some of the groups were amazingly nice. Other token lots had a few tokens of the same D&H number, but with all the edges, many of those quite rare. One lot, the Irish Drogheda group, contained all of the Drogheda numbers known, and most of them were blessed with some mint luster. They were nearly all UNC, though as usual in this little series, many of them had problems and looked VF. However, it was the nicest group of them I can imagine, and I gladly bought it. In most cases I bought the genuine trade pieces in any group if I bought any at all, but did buy a few counterfeits in a case or two, one being the 22 token counterfeit Lady Godiva tokens. Some of these were in high grade, and they are seldom seen thus, but around half were the usual VF or better. They were purchased partially for the grade, but also for the different varieties that will be able to be offered.

Over the next few lists you will see some of these groups, and many singles purchased this year, the latter in the Baldwin sale but also in Coin Ex and private sales. See below for information on Baldwin's future.

Do not forget the **new edition of Dalton and Hamer**, it received quite a bit of praise in the UK, and for that I was grateful. If you have not purchased your copy, it is available from me for \$125, \$135 postpaid. In the UK it is available from Alan Judd, micobwright@aol.com at 88 pounds postpaid. At the current rate that is around \$115, so those in the UK do get a bargain. One Deluxe edition remains, only one, \$250 postpaid.

The British Token Congress was a success as usual, and they set a record, think 116 attendees, and will bet that is beat this coming year. It will be in Warwick, a wonderful town with an amazing castle you can tour, a fine High Street, and lots of interesting shops. It will be at the Hilton. If you wish to attend, let me know and I will set it up for you. If it follows the usual date progression, it will be 6,7,8 October.

AUCTIONS---A new auction firm, made from Baldwin's and St. James, will now be in effect---Steve Fenton, Knightsbridge coins, St. James Auctions, has formed a new merger company, "Baldwins of St. James". He has bought all of Baldwin's stock, including tokens. Baldwin's will march on with retail sales under the direction of Neil Paisley, and a newly hired staff. Seth Freeman left in December.

We shall hope that DNW comes to the fore, and has an auction in early October.

In order to bring you a good look at some of the tokens purchased, the 17th, and 19th century tokens will be a smaller offering, and there will be a special book list put out later, with 200+ books for sale.

PUDDINGTON 5. This token has been found to be from **Devonshire**, not Bedfordshire, and it also has, therefore, been listed where it ought to be in the new D&H addenda under Devonshire #13. D&H lists Beds 5, though, so if looking in D&H for photos, that is where to find it.

Bust R, William Waller.//A ship. Hair detail missing, a couple marks on Waller’s cheek, the reverse weak in the center. Grade GVF, this one about par with the average one found. **There are around 15 of these traced**, only ONE is UNC to my knowledge This with a bit of EF detail. Nice color. \$975.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

AYLESBURY 7c 1796 Bust R//Flags, liberty cap. This plain edge token has better metal flow than others, and therefore is nearly struck up, though still tad weak in the center. Some fading red, and red in the devices, with nice surfaces. An anti-slavery piece. UNC, strong for type \$245.

SLOUGH 24 1794. Rampant Lion//The Red Lion Inn. Full luster super UNC \$235.

SLOUGH 27 1794 A Phoenix//Peckham’s Arms. Nice UNC, full luster \$245.

STOWE 29a’ 1796 View of a building, tree//Built anno domo 1764. Fully UNC farthing with red in the devices, nicely centered, great eye appeal, **RRR**, \$1075. I have seen a very few of these in commerce over the years, it is the first one that I have handled. Super piece!!

LOW HALL 1 1797 Man & horse in a gin//Low Hall Colliery.**RARE** two tiny edge tics, still a “lot of luster “ nice UNC. Couple hundred cheaper than the last one I had --- \$525.

LAKE TOKEN 2a 1796 Lake, castle, tree//Cumberland &c. **RARE** Farthing. GVF, or better, with rim tics on the reverse, budget rarity \$125.

GLOUCESTERSHIRE #7, 8, & 11 ARE PENNY TOKENS, the arms of Gloucester reverse of all.

GLOUCESTER 7 1797 St. John’s Church//Arms. Full luster bronzed UNC \$175. Ex York coll.

GLOUCESTER 8 1797 White Friars//Arms. Super luster, GEM Unc, \$195 Ex York Coll.

GLOUCESTER 11 1797 St. Bartholomew’s Hospital//Arms. Luster, nice UNC \$165.

BADMINTON 49 1796 Scales//A beggar receiving alms. Bronzed UNC \$165. BB III

BADMINTON 50 1795 Scales//Duke of Bedford, &c. Super, gemmy UNC R165 BB III

NEWENT 64 1796 Apple Tree//Legend, circular pattern. **GEMMY** UNC \$245.

EMSWORTH 9 1793. Female, globe, anchor//Ship. **Scarce**. Die buckling, EF \$55.

EMSWORTH 13. 1794 Bust Earl Howe//Britannia. Some red, tad luster GEF+ \$65.

EMSWORTH 39 1794 Earl Howe//”The Tars of olde England”//Anchor, Cable. These are on small flans, with rough surfaces, white metal, some tin pest. Seldom seen **RR** nets VF \$110. BBIII.

PETERSFIELD 47 1793 Mounted Dragoon//Stork. Choice surfaces, UNC/AU \$85.

DOVER 16 1794 Bust Wm Pitt//Arms of Dover. Super surfaces, luster UNC \$110.

LANCASTER 49 1793 John of Gaunt//Arms of Liverpool. **RR**. A rare mule, EF-AU \$120.

LANCASTER 51 ND John of Gaunt//Bishop Blaze. **RARE** Nice surfaces, about EF \$125.

ECCLESTON 58 1794 Bust Eccleston/Ship. Nice red and brown UNC just \$110. Choice \$135.

LIVERPOOL 64 1791 Ship/Arms, liver bird. Tad red, Choice UNC \$145

LIVERPOOL 66 1791 Ship//Arms, Liver Bird, luster, choice UNC \$155.

LIVERPOOL 68 1791 Ship//Arms, liver bird, Luster, really super UNC \$165.

LIVERPOOL 108 1794 Ship//Arms, Liver Bird, 90% RED, UNC \$165.

MANCHESTER 135e 1793 Porter with pack//Arms. 2 tiny spots, great luster, UNC \$75.

ROCHDALE 140 1791 Man in Loom//Hanging Fleece. Choice, dusty original UNC \$145.

ROCHDALE 140 ND Uniface of the man in loom, in SILVER, this with quite a bit of wear, it seems it was probably a pocket piece. At least Fine, this ex Dr. Doty, yours \$250.

KEMPSON 65 ND Royal Exchange. Arms, London. 1 sm spot in legend. UNC \$195.

KEMPSON 70 1797 Westminster Bridge//Justice Standing. No rub and nice luster, with a group of small spots on the Bridge side at the rim at 10:00, UNC, bronzed, flashy, \$325.

London, Westminster 97. 1797 Cordwainer's Hall//Arms of London. **RARE**. there is a very small scratch on the obverse, and the die is failing but all is there, nice token \$325. Ex Robbie Brown.

NATIONAL 177 1789 George III//Rays, Arms of London, visit to St Paul's. Struck for the celebration for George III's return from "madness". **SILVER**, toned AU, from my collection \$275.

NATIONAL 183 1789 Bust George III//Crown, Rose and Thistle---ribbon with the legend "To Transport turned a People's Fears"----The transports were convicts, usually convicted of something as small as stealing a loaf of bread, and were put into ships and sent to Australia. Not all that much earlier, they came to America, but with America a new country, that stopped. Transportation, as they called it, tore families apart. They could have a sentence of a few years, or life, and very few of the people so taken came back. This token is the only one that mentions this action, these are **RRR**, and all are White Metal. This one **FULLY GILT** with some original flash, but some toning. I bought the one in the Noble sale, and have seen a total of three in commerce. Including this---UNC, nice, \$850. This piece has very high rims on each side as well.

NATIONAL 187 1793 George III//Radiated Crown, King and Constitution. White metal. Partly toned, some original flash underneath, no peasting, **RR**, UNC \$345.

NATIONAL 192 1797 George III/Royal Thanksgiving at St. Paul's **Gilt Copper**----There are three small black marks in the obverse field, one on the reverse, otherwise as made. UNC \$ 275.

HOWARD 207 ND Bust Howard//Death of, &c. **FULLY BRIGHT** UNC, WM, **RARE** \$375

PAINE 208 ND Bust Thomas Paine// "The Mountain in Labor". On dark white metal, easily EF, obverse with NO peasting, the reverse with a few small patches of it. GVF, **RARE** \$795

Political, Social 221 1789 Bust of Fox//Free and independent electors of Westminster. This one in copper, and a very **RARE** token, with an old ticket included. UNC, no marks, nice \$425. **RR**.

SLAVE---- 235 ND Kneeling chained slave// "Whatever ye would do" &c---white metal, this one very nice, no peasting, a lovely gray color, with light undertones. **RARE** GEF, very nice \$850.

BLACKFRIARS 257a' ND A Friar staning//Arms, supporters. Very sharp and nice tad red, \$135.

BURCHELL'S 274 ND Sugar Plumbs for Worms//Anodyne necklace. Quack medicine AU \$75

DAVIDSON'S 295 1795 Female, Sword, shield/Hands hold crowned triangle. R&B UNC \$110.

- DENTON'S **RARE** 299 1796 Collector at table, looking at coins---man standing, placing a dunce cap on the collector///Two boys racing, "Asses Racing for Halfpence". Bronzed, nearly mark free and what there is, is very tiny---Slight wear on the reverse, or strike weakness. Net AU++, \$1500.
- DODD'S 300 ND Bust Handel/Harp &c. Full strike on a thick flan, UNC \$135.
Another, but on the usually seen thin flan, with the weakness on the harp, UNC \$85.
- EATON'S 301 1795 Bust Eaton//Cock and Swine. Centers tad weak, R&B AU, \$75.
- FOWLER'S 306 1794 Neptune, trident//Men in boat, Whale. Those looking for a sharp strike on this piece know how hard that is to obtain. Two here, one is slabbed, AU 58, a full strike with one mark in the reverse field. The next, R&B UNC, **full luster full strike**, 1 tone spot, overall about the best I have ever seen overall--- and hard to imagine a better look and strike, \$255.
- SKIDMORE 310b 1795 Hackney Church//DAR Cypher. Gem UNC, full luster, and at least **Scarce** if not **RARE**, the copy of the Rebello token by Skidmore. \$375.
- HALL'S 315 1794 Jeffrey Dunstan (Dwarf) Hall's &c. Marks, lightly handled, UNC \$120
- HALL'S 319c ND A Toucan//Hall's &c. Reverse 50% red, a very nice example \$145.

These contained in two turned wood boxes, that have screw on lids, one seal is wording, the other is of the Devil, but as much interest as those have, the boxes have some too, each has the Royal Seal on the inside lid, and "Chief Engraver of his majesty's Seals---B., Wyon. Thus, 2 boxes, 2 seals, all EF+, and a very unusual offering---the pair, \$165.

TRIAL PORTRAIT OF PRINCESS LOUISA in copper, held in a ring set in a square 67mm frame, the portrait at 60mm, set inside the frame. When struck, these were medals of 32 mm. Louisa was the 4th daughter of Queen Victoria, and this piece was taken from the original wax model on slate that is in the British museum. The back of the square card this trial sits in is signed, "one of the Royal Children, 1851"and presumably in (Leonard). C. Wyon's hand. A check of handwriting says that this is true. Another rare item for you to ponder, as made, \$275.

GIFFARD'S BALOON---in 1878 this medal was made as a souvenir of ascension in the balloon, which was **on a tether over Paris.** The medal is 50mm, fully gilt and seems to be copper under that, the piece with none of it showing, with a ribbon and hanger. Best one I have seen. Obv, view of the balloon over Paris, \$145.

SOHO MINT---Matthew Boulton Death medal. Bronze, 44mm, BHM 661, Bust to right//Farewel, legend reading "brighter scenes I seek above in the realm of peace and love". This medal has a bit of dark areas in the metal on the obverse, and one small spot, the reverse superb. Ex Dr. Richard Doty, Smithsonian, who included a written description of the piece, and a note he bought it at Baldwin auction 12. EF, \$220.

TOWER BRIDGE. AE, 77mm. 1794 Queen Victoria, With the Prince and Princess of Wales---The reverse the new London Bridge. A city of London medal, this one is flawless, and beautiful. As new, \$395.

FRANCO-PRUSSIAN WAR---The Siege of Paris, and the Pigeon Postal service. 1870-71. A rare piece, with Luteita seated on a cannon, releasing a pigeon. During the siege of Paris by the Prussians, there was no way of getting messages out of the city, thus pigeon post was used. Reverse, a pigeon flying over his coop. 63mm AE, no marks, no problems, superb surfaces. From my collection. \$395.

BOX MEDAL, BRITAIN'S HOPE---a round 28mm case, 14mm high, containing three WM medals in excellent condition, obverses Queen Victoria, Prince Albert, and "Britain's hope", the young child Edward. The reverses have Britannia Standing, a steam engine train, and a sailing ship. Nice condition, and a great souvenir, one that I bought several of while the getting was good years ago. Yours today for \$225.

THOMAS FISHER---issued a 2 penny token in the 18th century, and though there is no date on it, it was **issued in 1735.** These usually come worn, and often impaired, this one not impaired---obv with a bird, with a worm in his beak, all quite easily seen. Smooth surfaces, The reverse his promise to pay. VF, net, \$265.

QUEEN VICTORIA, HER DIAMOND JUBILEE, this a special medal, silver, 38mm Coventry issue. BHM 3536, it is **RARE,** obv Bust of the Queen facing left//Reverse. Arms of Coventry, (elephant and castle in a shield,) cat above, "Coventry" below. A. S. Tomson, Mayor. EF and very nice, yours \$145.

THE QUEEN MARY---the RMS Queen Mary medal for her maiden voyage, 1936. Bz, by Bayes for the Royal Mint. The ship seen from the front, starboard view, dolphins in waves //the reverse, the New York skyline seen through the old Bargate in Southampton. The medal new---70mm. It is housed in its original green leather case, the case new as well---and that in the original cardboard box, in good condition. BHM 4282m Eimer 2036. The entire production, box, case, and medal mint state. Quite a find!! \$450.

NINE CHECKS, ---an offering of these checks, large bank style, couple railroad, 1878-1883, each bearing the diamond shaped orange revenue stamp needed at that time. Hard to find in nice condition, all nine \$65.
