18th Century “CONDER” TOKENS-----17th Century tokens—19th Century tokens
Silver tokens, Unofficial Farthings, Medals, medalets, unusual historical items----

A big hello to all---and welcome to list #80. Will continue this time with some of the tokens picked up from various locations, most of them from London, over the last year.

Perhaps a “state of the hobby” statement is in order—along with a little history.

In the days before the internet, collecting 18th century British tokens was simpler. Not easier, just simpler. Tokens gravitated to the few dealers that existed, some bigger collections went to the auctions. There was no internet, and no E-Bay, most of the back and forth went from collector to dealer by phone or by mail. Nice and simple, and the tokens stayed within a small dealer---collector area.

With the internet, the dealers and the public expanded their offerings, and suddenly had buyers all over the world. Along came E-Bay, which still makes the market on lower priced items. . Prices range today from really cheap to stupidly expensive. Some E-Bay sellers get little for their offerings, and some sellers seem to think the tokens are gold, not copper, or that the buyers are idiots. For better or worse, the internet has awakened interest all over, and buyers in many countries now are customers for at least a few pieces. Demand has jumped greatly since the internet began.

With interest and demand increasing, the prices also went up. It suddenly became easier to see, even for the dealer, which pieces were wanted, which were not, and which ones were really tough to get in high grade. This has made for some really large jumps in the prices for many of the tokens if uncirculated. The lower grade pieces have been drawn up with them, but certainly not to the high level of the super condition tokens. The market has fluctuated a bit with the late recession, but is rather stable now.

18th Century British Conder tokens are still not a huge collectible. Demand has certainly expanded, and there are many more collectors in the mix. Still, by coin collector standards, the number of collectors after the tokens are still small. When comparing the prices of our tokens to the prices seen for coins of the same era, we still have a bargain.

The influx of new material is not steady, but rather a bit erratic and actually it has always been that way. Sometime sales of huge collections at auction brings many new tokens on the market, other years there is little to be had, and the stock of the dealer dwindles, leaving him looking at empty boxes. This also causes the prices to rise, as the collector cannot find material to buy, and the dealer is forced to locate items, and pay more to buy in order to keep up with demand.

The current demand seems to be for choice UNC tokens, high grade, no matter the rarity, and prices have hit a new high for some of the more common material. The middle grade items show the prices holding their own, and trending upward.

What I do as a dealer has changed greatly since I started selling 20 years ago. The collectors have become far more knowledgeable and the demand is for better and better tokens, which the dealers struggle to find---as there are only so many available at any given time. As they say, they are simply not making them anymore. So, the hobby has evolved, as have many other things in life. It is still, for me, a lot of fun!!

The new edition of Dalton and Hamer should be indeed out later this year. Still a ways to go, most of the topics are covered, the addenda completed, some re-writes need to be done, and photos to be taken, and the book assembled. So, lots yet to do, but the light is showing at the end of the tunnel.

I lost some names due to the computer blow up earlier this year, so if you wish to be on the list for the new edition, please let me know again. I hope you all have a happy and healthy spring and summer!!

Liverpool and Manchester Railway, White metal, 48mm-- to commemorate the opening of the rail service in 1830. Train on Sankey Viaduct//Entrance to Liverpool station. Toned, minor mks, nice \$75.

Bust Captain A. E. Haines, bust to right. Served 1861 to 1896, and was the developer of methods of field fortification during war. Reverse, 2 men inspect fortifications. AE 51mm, some red, interesting!! \$65.

This is a subject I have never seen on a medal. Most interesting war item-----nicely done!!

George VI Elizabeth, Coronation. This is a real photo medal, uniface, the King in uniform, the Queen next to him, it is a 37mm pictorial coronation piece. (1938). GVF, and in superb condition, \$55. /very scarce.

Kingston, Jamaica---Man holding horse//Carriage and horses, M. Hobart, Ferrygrass. The issuer intended this as a halfpenny token, but no value inscribed. AVF, one spot hard to read, pictorials OK, \$75. (1800)/

Isle of Lundy---Martin Harman decided to issue his own money in 1929, not exactly legal, and it was the only year he did so. Penny, featuring a whole Puffin, 1 Puffin denominated. Also a half puffin, of course denominated as a half puffin. Best pair I have seen, full luster, 100% red, own new ones. Pair \$150.

Jagersfontein Diamond Mine---issued by the municipality, South Africa. Interesting penny size token, this one good for **3 gallons of water**!! Obv: Arms. Rev, Value (water). Issued 1900. VF, rare item \$75.

Australia-----**Internment camp 3 pence, WWII**, KM-Tn2.1. Rare enough item, VF \$75.

Australia--- Early money for Australia was the pence and halfpence made by the people. Here are a few—

Queensland, 1864—Panny, obv Kangaroo and Emu/Rev, Sawyer, Tobacco, Brisbane. VF, mks, \$120.

Penny, (ND) 1850's--- Justice Standing, cornucopia. **Parker, Ironmonger, Geelong**. Nice VF \$75.

Penny, 1858—Justice Seated//Kangaroo, Emu---**Me3lbourne, Victoria**. F -VF \$75.

Penny 1855—A Building—**Hobart Town//Wood**, wine and spirit merchant. GVF, super, bargain at \$150.

Penny, 1859—Kangaroo, Emu//Justice. **General circ piece**, Peace and Plenty. Cleaned, net F, only \$25.

SIEGE OF PARIS--by the Prussian Army, -1870-71. This is an amazing medal, **silver**, 65mm, in a framed and glazed turned brass holder (over 100mm) allowing viewing of both sides of the medal. It was presented to the Society of English Friends, with the engraved legend, in French, thanking the society for going to the aid with goods to the Commune of Villemomble during the Franco-Prussian war-- with their "profound esteem". Villemomble is about 9 miles to the **east** of Paris, and it is not known how the English managed to send supplies to the Commune during the Prussian siege!! **As to the medal, some inquiry leaves it as expected, most likely UNIQUE--**it is unknown by any in the trade in the UK or France, save this one. This EF, in the original box. Medal, all hand engraved on a shaved agricultural piece-- the brass holder about new-- all contained in the box (114mm) is VF+. Rarity, condition, history, it has it all. -- \$1125.

A second note on this-- The only one known belonged to the society in England, they disbanded some years ago. The medal made its way to the sale floor----I could not resist it. This is, of course, a piece with no value at all, except what the owner puts on it. Many thought it worth twice my asking price.

ANTI- SLAVERY Bust, William Wilberforce/Alligorical scene, "I have heard their cry" &c---Wilberforce pushed through Parliament a bill outlawing slavery in all its forms in the British Empire. This medal was made to celebrate that, in 1807. Very minor rim tics, otherwise EF and beautiful, AE, 53mm, this piece is a very important one, with super surfaces and nice luster, bronzed, great eye appeal. \$950.

ANTI- SLAVERY Bz, 51mm, copper, very rare medal with the portrait of Thomas Clarkson on it, the only medal with his portrait, and he was the founder of the Anti Slavery Society. This medal for the Convention held in 1840 in England, to promote Anti Slavery world wide. The reverse of this medal has a slave in chains, "Am I not a man and a brother" legend. Some obv discoloration, allowing it to have a two tone look, some rub on the high points but EF overall. \$850. Very rare in this metal. **SOLD**
