MACCLESFIELD 3 1790 Bust Charles Roe/Genius, with mining tools. The Penny token--**RARE**.

A lacquered bronzed UNC with no marks or scratches, but a few light lacquer swirls noted, I am grading this piece AU though it is easily a full UNC. Still a very nice one, at \$480.

MACCLESFIELD 48 1791 Charles Rowe/Genius, mining tools. **RARE**, GVF \$42.

MACCLESFIELD 72 1792 Beehive, Bees/Genius, mining tools. Weak but about UNC \$45.

MACCLESFIELD 86 1791. Farthing. Bust Roe/Genius, &c, glossy UNC, **RARE**, \$145.

MACCLESFIELD 88 1792 Farthing. As the last, red in the devices, EF or better, \$135.

CORNWALL

COUNTY 2. 1791 Druid/Arms. Rim tick on rev, or as made, luster, sharp, net GEF \$75.

Another, no problems, lots of luster, slightly greenish tinge to the brown net AU \$85.

DERBYSHIRE

BUXTON 2 1796. Building, a crescent/Arms of Buxton. **The #2 RR**, only 30 struck, and A lacquered UNC, R&B, lots of flash and really no problems to speak of, \$650.

Derbyshire has but three tokens, all varieties of the same one, differing reverses and obverses,--- the first try, had a die break after 6 were struck.. The second piece, for sale here, suffered a broken die after 30 pieces were struck, and the last one, #3, had 200 struck. Thus there are 236 known from the entire county, as these three tokens comprise the lot.

POOLE 6. 1795 Hope with Anchor/Arms. some red AU \$55. 100% fading red obverse brown rev- UNC \$110. Another, with a double struck reverse, fading red over all, UNC \$135..

SHERBORNE 7 1793 Beehive, Cypher/Two headed eagle. All brown, and this one on a very nice flan. **Scarce**. AU, The lightest of wear, even the eagle has detail on the breast, \$145. A GVF, \$55.

DURHAM**PAGE TWO**

SUNDERLAND 3 1796 Sunderland Bridge, ship/legend. Struck over a Anglesey penny, this piece with full luster, fully centered, some red, and really as made. **Superb RR+** UNC \$2450.

This example right up at the top for eye appeal and condition. No disappointments.

STOCKTON 9a 1794 Bust L/Ship. The edge, usually blundered, is not so on this example, it is all readable. Other than that, the usual VF look, just \$85.

BRAINTREE 3 1794 A Building/Hope Standing. Period after legend right next to, and touching, anchor. **Extremely rare**, full luster, UNC. There is a thin flan crack from the gown through to the anchor, it is NOT a scratch. Hard to imagine a better one, now \$375.

CHELMSFORD 5 1794 Shire Hall/Crown, scepter, full date, tiny spot at rim, luster UNC \$95.

CHELMSFORD 7 1794 King and Constitution/Hope Standing. EF-AU \$45. R&B UNC \$95.

Isle of Lundy--- One Puffin (puffin pictorial). Martin Harman issue in 1929-- this VF, cleaned, just \$28.

Card Counters---21.9mm. Man Seated/rose and snake--"keep your temper", pair, nearly alike, VF-GVF \$25. A 29,5mm token, with a star on one side and all four suits represented, hearts, clubs, etc, Rev "10", VF \$15.

France---a Bordello token, three undressed maids on the obverse, "Ladies House, pretty girls" reverse. This is a 22.3mm shell card, in VF condition, no problems just a tad of wear. All these are **rare**---\$95.

Lead Token, probably 18th Century,(earlier?) 27.5mm lead--- with a padlock, deadlock, and other fastening themes on one side, four dots and a 1 in a circle on the reverse. Unusual, good strikes, unknown use. \$55.

George III, Charlotte---marriage, and coronation. A brass 25.6mm token, **RARE**, Busts to right/reverse with hearts, a cherub, and a ribbon "Felicitas Britanniae--copper, nice VF+, \$45.

Defeat of Napoleon---1814, Br, 25mm. Napoleon, sitting backward on an ass, being pulled by the devil--- "inseparable friends"/ rev, names of capturers. Taken to Elbe, he escaped, and had to be brought to justice again in 1815, with his defeat at Waterloo. Copper, GF, all there and no spots, great token \$38.

Wilcox's Famous Hat---and prices for same, with a view of the hat on each side. Brass, 27mm, GF \$18.

Powder Flask---small size, 45 X 98mm--dates from the Civil war or shortly after, dented, very ornate, \$95.

Telegraph Key, mounted on a board, with a early style plug for electricity, probably not the original one. The type used by railroads, Western Union, and others and appears to be early 20th century to about 1930. Working condition, though I did not plug it in---not restored or cleaned-- it is a great piece for display. \$185.

Vase---with coins imbedded around, mostly foreign, include 1904 American token, 1860 British penny- the vase not all that wonderful as it is beginning to crumble in a few places. It is better than I made it sound there, beaded around, ornate, with around 12 coins, all appear to be copper .Also contains what look like rubies and other gem stones, the overall look very interesting indeed. As is, \$65. 6 inches high.

Second Central American and Caribbean Games, Havana, Cuba---cloth badge, red at top inset with the linked Olympic rings, blue and white stripes below. **This badge inscribed on the back,** in ink, by Cuban Olympic swimmer "Bebito Shmit Olympiadas 1930 Equipo de Natacion". The badge, for a blazer jacket, has never been worn, and is 103 X 88 mm. A Cuban swimmer, Shmit won three gold and one silver medals in these games. An accident forced him to quit swimming after 1930, which may account for the fact that this badge was not attached to a coat, but kept by him for many years. As new, with an info page, \$225.

Medals of Karl Goetz---a very famous medalist, who recorded the 1st and 2nd world wars on medals, many of them satirical, with of course the German point of view. Listed by Kienast catalog number.

K183, 1916. Death of Boelker, WWI ace/rev, Eagle, warplane. Large format, **RARE**, bz 88mm. AU \$350

K192, 1917. Peace Offering in the Reichstag/British- Lloyd George- reject offer.bz, 57mm, Nice AU \$225

K267, 1918 Abdication of Ludwig III of Bavaria/signing the declaration, the war lost.Bz, 59mm AU+ \$195.
