Hello to all----Well, here I am again. Another interesting trip. I got a chance to spend a bit of time with friends, and I enjoy that a great deal. Oh, tokens, yes, bought some super pieces, in unreal condition, I spent days looking at the sales to decide what to bid on, picking nice condition items. I included some on this list-- both auctions had great stuff. The prices were very strong, but the tokens worth it. I shall hope you think so too.

Dalton and Hamer---- the new edition is not ready yet, but it shall be after the first of the year if all goes well. To clarify what will be in this edition, we have to start with the fact that the body of the book will be the same as the reprints you have most likely seen. To change that, the pieces in the addenda would have to be incorporated into the book, which would require the book to be re-numbered. This is not impossible, but doing this would require, in my estimation, at least 5 years time. And, with so many owning an earlier edition of D&H, the renumbering would bring a lot of controversy and problems within the collections. Thus, the body of the book will be the same as D&H wrote it in 1910-17.

So, what will be new about the book? It will contain an introduction that will include a lot of information that has not been put in any other edition. As one who sold these books on a regular basis over the last few years, I heard all the questions about using the book---most of them from Americans---and some of the questions were repeated enough that I decided that I would address how to use the book, questions about locations of tokens, about terms (such as Bis), rarity----though there is not a full answer to that anywhere, really, and prices---though it will NOT be a price guide, but will help understanding of the market.

Also planned is a map of the counties, and a few other lists that ought to help the book owner understand what he has and how to use it. It will also address some of the glaring errors in the original book. There will also be an addenda, a compilation of the addenda done by Davisson, along with Whitmore's, and a lot new that has happened since 2004, that now runs 67 pages or so.

The 2015 D&H does not have the final price worked out as yet. However, at the moment I see it being no more than \$115, a nice drop in price from the last editions. It is my hope that this lower price will bring more new collectors willing to buy the book. Though the final price has not been formalized, the estimate should be fairly close.

I am taking orders for it now, (send NO money), you shall simply be put on a list for contact when the book is done, and we can go from there.

Now, the list at hand. Lots to look at, and I shall hope that you enjoy it. Over the next few lists, you will see more of the items brought back from England. All the best, Bill

- KEMPSON 44a ND Somerset House//Arms. Some luster, UNC \$135.
- KEMPSON 63 ND Monument Erected//Arms. 50% red, few hairlines, UNC \$75.

- POL-SOCIAL 220 1789 Bust Dr. Willis// "Briton's Rejoice your King's Restored" Willis took the King on a long trip around Britain as part of his treatment to attempt to cure the King from "Madness". On this trip, itinerant token makers followed, and you will find little tokens dated 1789 for the King's visit throughout D&H. This piece, much original luster but partly toned, in White Metal as usual, net is AU, nice \$245.

The originals were 105mm, and made in 1854, with only 20 made in bronze, 5 of which are impounded in the Smithsonian. If you wish one of the 15 originals, I have one. Cronology of the Royal Families of England from 1066 (William I) to 1837, the crowning of Queen Victoria. Also on the lid are engraved JB to PB, and the date 1817. Thus a personalized gift as well as a Pitt momento. EF, nice A reasonable \$245.

Billy and Charlie---I love these---made in the 19th century, they purport to have been made in the 1000's, and they managed to fool a good many people including museum “experts”--- Of course, they were found out, and the pieces, purported to be genuine artifacts dug from the shores of the Thames, were finally declared false. They were nice enough to fool experts, so here is one, bronze, 78mm with hanger, Latin inscriptions. One side with two knights jousting, the other side with a King holding two keys. Though made to look old, and dug from the Thames, it is 1870 or so, not 1012, as it is dated. Fun item. \$225.
