The Baldwin Basement II sale is history, and it made history as nearly everything in the sale was fully UNC and though a bit dirty---100 or so years in a vault will do that--- the person who looked carefully could find many pieces gem or close to it. I bought as much as I could, considering the prices.

The collector always beats the dealer on price since the dealer needs to add some to what he paid. Thus am out of the market when the price goes well above value. Many of these did just that. But, that said, many nice ones came my way too, and some are on this list, since I received some of them in time to list them. I also purchased the remainder of a couple of collections, and bought a fair number of tokens at Coin-Ex and other venues, so all in all some very nice pieces were obtained this fall.

Items seldom seen will be on this and succeeding lists, and I hope you enjoy them.

The New edition of Dalton and Hamer is to go to the printer soon. It will be presented as a trial copy, correctable if there is anything wrong. When that is done, the printing will not take long. Hopefully, it will be done by mid November, the end of it at the outside. We now know what everything will cost. Thus, can quote a price for the book. \$125, not including postage, which will add \$10. So, finally, can price it.

You may, if you wish, send for the book and pay for it in advance, to me at the Copper Corner. When it is done one will be shipped to you from the publisher, Thomas Publications.

The DELUXE EDITION will take somewhat longer, we do not have the book printed to offer to the custom bindery as yet, then it will take some time to finish. Honestly, I still need to find a good custom binder, and though I know of a couple they are not close by. With luck, the deluxe binding will be done by Christmas. The cost for this book once again not determined, but think it will be around \$200 plus postage.

As I have not settled the price, please do not send money for the Deluxe Edition. Soon, though, I hope.

 BLACKFRIAR'S 257a ND A Friar//Arms of London. This piece has prooflike luster, sharp strike, some red, and is very choice. Hard to find with all of this, from my collection, Ch UNC \$165.
 CHELSEA 277 1795 Man petitioning Britannia//Hope, Anchor. Red in devices, Ch AU \$125
 EATON'S 301. 1795 Bust Eaton//Cock, Swine. EF/GVF, nice surfaces, \$45. AU \$75.
 FORSTER'S 302 1795 Crown, music score//Prince of Wales Crest. Very minor reverse strike weakness, super surfaces, luster. One of my favorite designs, fully UNC \$185. Another, AU \$125.
 REBELLO 309 1795 Hackney Church//DAR cypher. Private token, with 24 reported struck, but that must have been the first order. **RARE**, but not RR. This token has superior design and die work, one look and you know an expert hand made it. Full luster UNC, and only \$395.
 SKIDMORE 310b 1795 Hackney Church//DAR cypher. This was Skidmore's copy after Rebello, and the work not as fine, but a choice, full luster, PROOFLIKE UNC—**Scarce--** \$375.
 HENDON 324 1794 A Church//Greyhound. These come on small thin flans, and are literally never struck up. This token only 7.1 grams, well under normal, as these usually are. Many have looked for a perfect one. Here it is. An Exceptional, fully struck, all on flan with nice surfaces example. Even the greyhound has detail on its side, as well as a full head with an eye. Easily the finest I have seen. A BB II token, but no ticket, this had to be in a major collection. UNC \$450

One of my favorite medals of all time, Wm Pitt the Elder was the voice in Parliament in 1766 who convinced that body that taxation without representation was NOT right, and that the American colony deserved a break. It prevented war at that time. This medal, by Pingo, was struck in that year. This one is unsigned, a slightly later strike.AE, 42mm. Full luster UNC, as made \$575.

William Pitt the Elder, this a very rare SILVER medal, 42mm, bust and wording exactly the same as the last example, with the signature of Pingo. Made at the time and dated 1766. I have had this in my own collection since 1994. The medal is easily AU, very slight wear, no marks, scratches, superb piece \$1495. Of course, the peace extracted by Pitt only lasted 10 years, and the rest, as they say, is history.

French Canada---Items from the days of French Colonial Rule are very hard to find. Here are a pair of items, being sold together---the first a playing card from 18th century Quebec. It is of the type used as money, and was in fact known as playing card money in New France, this a Jack of Clubs, with "Lancelot" printed on the bottom right. It has a plain back. The piece is well preserved, no folds, stiff paper, and the hand-laid colors are wonderful. This with a hotel receipt, Quebec, 1721, for room and service. Hand written on laid paper, with a partial watermark, nice signature, and stamped on the back. New France playing card money, and fiscal documents, are scarce. These easily in VF or better condition. The pair, \$295.

Canada---political token----"No Parting of the Ways---Sept 21, 1911" with John Bull with bulldog on leash, and a figure representing Canada---man with broad hat and wearing a maple leaf// "Canada an Adjunct" on the reverse, date September 21, 1902. 31mm BZ with loop for wearing. EF, rare item \$145.

Slave Trade Abolished----- Penny token, Macaulay and Babbington, **Sierra Leone.** The token dated 1814. Though England abolished slavery in 1807, it took, in many cases, some years to get everything in place to do so, and the plantations on Sierra Leone were formally freed in 1814. This has a plantation owner, most likely, shaking hands with an ex slave on the obverse, The reverse is in a form of Arabic, and points to the piece being made for local use. Copper, this example is VF, certainly some wear. \$225.

International Exhibit, London, 1862. Heavy fully gilt bronze medal, 41mm, Bust of Prince Albert//interior of the exhibit building. Two things of note, the reverse is of a long hall, and was designed by Weiner, one of the best at depth perception, and is well done. The second, is that by 1862 the Ullhorn coin press was being demonstrated, and this medal was "struck in the building". Full gilding, UNC but minor marks. \$85.

John Wesley and Francis Asbury----portrait (Ferrotypes) the obverse and reverse with one of each person, in a holder ring. Really clear and nice condition portraits, the ring very close to as made, this is a piece marred only by one black mark on the obverse portrait. These are rare in such nice condition, and only \$245.

Love Tokens---each made from a Liverpool Conder token. These are rare on 18th C Provincial pieces. The first, Sam Wallin, Sarah Crofter, March 10, 1793 London—2 hearts United. Holed for suspension. All on one side, arms of Liverpoos and 1791 date on the reverse. The second piece, Friendship token, Mary Picop, Ann Lord, 1792, decorative border. As the last, the reverse the Liverbird, 1791. Each is \$275.

William III Coronation. Sept 8, 1831. King and Queen, crowns on table between them//Crown, Rose, "Crowned with the people's love"&c. Brass, 28mm, very strong and nice GVF \$38.
